## **Annex Highlights**

The first item offered by Michaan's Auctions in the January Annex Auction is a **Studio Pottery Tea Article Including PAZ**, which sold for \$59 as Lot 471. Michaan's Auctions regularly features quality home goods, including this tea set, which includes a ceramic teapot, a ceramic pot with pour sprout, and a set of seven ceramic saucers and cups. Each of these items is of a red-brown color with a glaze on top, which is black on the saucer and cups, and largely clear to white on the two pots. This group of items features exquisite craftsmanship and is unmistakably handmade. While

there are limited mass-produced options that can match the quality of this piece, one example is the Miya company, which produces a two-cup and teapot set for \$70. Not only does this option fail to provide the additional pot, four cups, and seven saucers, but its design reveals evidence of its mass production.

Next is Lot 495, a Japanese and Studio Pottery Bowls, Etc., which sold for \$26 in the January Annex Auction. This lot features a total of five bowls, two plates with raised edges, and two larger serving plates. Each of these ceramic dishes features a unique design and glaze pattern, highlighting the handmade and unique quality of the set.
