

Quality Furniture for Less

Welcome to our blog series which highlights some of the great finds available at Michaan's Auctions monthly Annex Auctions. In this series, we will highlight a few examples of furniture and other home goods recently sold at Michaan's Annex Auction and compare them with their supposed equivalent from a big retail option such as IKEA, Wayfair, and others.

years past are still available at Michaan's

Annex Highlights

The first item sold in Michaan's
Auctions March Annex sale is the

Square Coffee Table, which sold for
\$7. This table's fine wooden
construction is highlighted by a deep
amber finish, which brings the
materiality of the wood front of mind.
Each corner features thin dual legs,
which are reinforced by similarly slim
cross braces, providing incredible
durability without losing any of the
design's elegance. The coffee table also
includes practical design elements,
including a raised edge to prevent spills,
while overall offering a distinct,



sophisticated design allows it to be placed in even the most high-scale design schemes.

Reaching a similar level of sophistication at major retailers requires spending significantly more money. One option, the IKEA Aesperod, costs \$160, and although it matches the thin forms and elegance of the option from Michaan's Auctions, it is made of metal and feels too cold to be the centerpiece of a living room. Like many contemporary options, it effectively blends into the background of an interior design scheme, while

alternatively, the **Square Coffee Table** from Michaan's would be an excellent centerpiece to any room it is placed in.

In contrast, the Bria Coffee Table from Wayfair features excellent design but misses many of the features evident in the **Square Coffee Table.** Without a raised edge, and with a smaller size, the Wayfair piece may work in specific installations but is unlikely to fulfill the needs of a homeowner or young family.

Another interesting item that recently sold at Michaan's Annex
Auctions is a **Pair of Green Upholstered, Queen Ann style**

Wing Chairs, which sold for \$52 on Tuesday, March 12th. This pair of chairs features an intricately scalloped back, and dramatically sweeping wings, which curve downwards into armrests that blend seamlessly into the seat cushion. The chairs feature intricately carved feet that mimic the angles of the curves found throughout the chair and pull the design into a cohesive whole. The classic, timeless design fits with any number of interior design schemes, from the most antique to contemporary. The cushioning is durable yet comfortable, and in good shape. Overall, the chair is in perfect structural condition with only minor wear evident.

In comparison, a big-box option, such as the IKEA Strandmon Wing
Chair, sells for over \$300, more than six times the price of a pair of quality chairs available at Michaan's Auctions. Despite the huge price difference, the IKEA

option is of significantly lower quality, as it is upholstered with a thin, scratchy cover, and constructed of budget materials which will fail to survive over the decades. Additionally, the chair must be assembled, while the **Pair of Green Upholstered, Queen Ann style** Wing Chairs from Michaan's Auctions are ready to use. Similarly, the Anndi Armchair, available on Wayfair, mimics high-quality options but falls short because of budget choices in several areas. For example, the chair only features two carved feet, rather than four, and again features a cover that



uses significant amounts of polyester, leading to early wear and tear.
