Diamonds, Escher's Ant Prove Lifting Powers in Michaan's Fine Auction

All that glittered proved to be sales gold in Michaan's fine auction of December 11, 2015, as quality diamond jewelry lead sales. The largest single diamond in the auction lay in an 8.66 carat, round brilliant cut stunner, listed as lot 5060. The platinum and diamond ring, projected at \$50,000-80,000, solidly surpassed estimates becoming the highest figure at sale, realizing \$153,400. Yet another ring also set in platinum, but this time with a 5.05 carat emerald cut diamond achieved \$44,250 (lot 5057, \$20,000-30,000). Also hitting the over \$40,000 mark was a gorgeous diamond and platinum bracelet of thirty-nine emerald cut stones weighing in at a total of approximately 25.00 carats (lot 5037, \$18,000-25,000, sold for \$41,300). A diamond encrusted leaf motif necklace once featured in Christie's "Magnificent Jewels" auction of 1977 closed at \$34,220 (lot 5022, \$15,000-30,000), alongside an art deco bracelet (lot 5025A, \$4,000-6,000) and lapel watch (lot 5031, \$3,000-5,000) that were each secured for \$11,800 apiece.

The fine art figures were lead by Henri Lebasque's oil on canvas *Reclining Nude* that realized \$118,000 (lot 5077, \$100,000-120,000), however, an Escher lithograph became a sleeper hit of the sale section. *Ant* more than carried its weight amazingly selling for over 11 fold projections, realizing \$47,200 from its estimate of \$2,000-4,000 (lot 5137). Fine Art Department Manager Kyrah Reddey summed up the successful sale stating, "I pulled this piece for the fine sale knowing it had potential, but was still pleasantly surprised at the end result. Reflecting upon it now, it is clear that all of the ingredients were there to make this piece skyrocket: Escher's immense following, the rarity of the subject matter for the artist and the low production at only twenty copies made bidders clamor for the



lithograph." Rounding out the department's top performers was a Charles Schulz drawing, *Peanuts Cartoon Tug of War* (lot 5134, \$6,000-9,000, sold for \$15,340) and yet another Escher offering in a school of geometric fish titled *Depth* (lot 5136, \$5,000-7,000, sold for \$12,980).

Of honorable mention from the decorative arts portion of the auction is an exceptional Tiffany Studios Tyler lampshade example, circa 1910. The shade of a background of graduating, rectangular, mottled green leaded glass becomes intersected by an encircling scroll design of dichroic glass in fine swirls of amber and golden yellow. Finished by a large Onion brass base, the lamp was purchased by a Utah based dealer at auction for a respectable \$18,880 (lot 5522, \$15,000-20,000).
