## Modern at Michaan's

Michaan's follow-up 20<sup>th</sup> Century Design sale brings exciting offerings of furniture and decoration to auction on April 6, 2013. Over 175 lots will comprise the sale, with featured artisans such as Charles and Ray Eames, George Nelson and Peter Hvidt. The available range of pieces is quite varied, providing a broad catalog of modern lots to the bidding public. Wonderful examples reflecting this range are seen in the following auction highlights, personally selected by Michaan's 20th Century Design Specialist, Greg Favors.

Perhaps one of the most noteworthy collections in the sale lies in over 15 lots of Joseph Eichler furniture. The pieces are part of an Eichler family estate collection and reflect his career as well as the classic Eichler style. Featured from the collection are a CSS wall unit (lot 1213A, \$3,500-3,750) and an Omni shelving unit (lot 1100, \$750-850). Both pieces were once furnishings in a model Eichler home and their open designs mirror Eichler's architectural sensibilities. Modern collectors should find great interest in the pieces as their rarity, signature style, functionality, practicality and wonderful condition are evident.



Another substantial furniture grouping in the auction is found in 7 lots of George Nakashima pieces. Estimates are conservative for the furniture, whose desirable designer continues to command premium prices in the marketplace. Michaan's Auctions will present a free edge desk in black walnut (lot 1126, \$7,500-8,500), a pair of grass seat foot stools (lot 1128, \$2,000-2,500), a free edge side table (lot 1131, \$2,000-2,250), a square table in black walnut (lot 1130, \$2,000-2,250), a bar stool (lot 1129, \$1,500-1,800) and a Sundra occasional table by Widdicomb (lot 1159, \$800-1,200) from the designer in April.

A free form sofa from modern furniture designer Vladimir Kagan makes an appearance in the auction as well (lot 1132, \$3,750-4,250). Reupholstered in teal microfiber, the sofa of fluid design measures an approximate 88 inches in length, 43 inches in depth and 15 inches in height. The New York Times recognized the modern furniture greats influence on the genre, noting, "Vladimir Kagan is one of the most important furniture designers of the 20th century. Furniture designed by him in the forties, fifties and sixties have become icons of Modernity and an obligatory reference to every designer. He is the creative grandfather of a whole new generation of designers." Examples of Kagan's work are found in the V&A London, the Vitra Design Museum and the Die Neue Samlung in Germany as well as in some of the most recognized museums in the United States.

Yet another wonderful furniture piece is found in lot 1258, a Harvey Probber rosewood chest (\$1,800-2,250). The chest is a prime example of his work, as it is understated and modern with form and function taking precedence. Numerous shelves and drawers are condensed into the interior, making the piece quite a practical storage unit as well. The use of bookmatched Brazilian rosewood is another rare and coveted element of the chest. The harvesting of Brazilian rosewood has been extremely controlled for over a decade, making it quite an expensive and sought after material.

Reflecting modern design's playful and distinctive side is a multicolored ball clock by George Nelson for Howard Miller (lot 1201, \$500-700). Hour markers are fashioned by skewered, painted wooden balls in powder blue, coral, olive green and black. Animated hour and minute hands compliment the overall look, set upon a simple white, round face. Jovial modern pieces such as this ball clock helped George Nelson make his mark at the Herman Miller furniture company, as he produced some of the 20th century's most iconic modernist furniture pieces.
